North Lake Tahoe - What's New Winter 2018-19

NORTH LAKE TAHOE, Calif./Nev. (Winter, 2018-19) — North Lake Tahoe, home to the nation's largest concentration of downhill ski resorts, invests in new snowmaking equipment, energy-saving technologies, expanded winter events and luxury aprés amenities this winter, furthering its commitment to sustainability, modern luxury, family travel and wellness.

The region's 12 distinct communities host a series of winter events, including the 4th Tahoe Film Fest, celebrating internationally acclaimed environmental and foreign films; and WinterWonderGrass, a mountain bluegrass festival and craft brew tasting.

Families are invited to Merry Days and Holly Nights at Squaw Valley | Alpine Meadows; Noel Nights at Northstar California and Northern Lights at Incline Village and Crystal Bay. Guests can enjoy farm-to-table dinners with Olympians, magical sleigh rides, live music, performing arts and holiday celebrations throughout the region.

For luxury apres and wellness opportunities, North Lake Tahoe's spas incorporate indigenous stones and natural elements of the Sierra, including Northstar California's <u>Tahoe Spa & Wellness Center</u> which tailors spa treatments for skiers and riders. Various yoga studios offer diverse classes, including Squaw Valley's <u>Wanderlust Studio</u> which debuts new <u>AlReal Yoga</u> classes.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

- <u>Diamond Peak</u> is the first ski resort in Lake Tahoe to become <u>STOKE Certified</u>, an award that recognizes its sustainability initiatives. The resort also debuts the Village at Diamond Peak, a new mountain terrain park with features for all ability levels.
- <u>Boreal Mountain California</u> introduces the California Cruiser beginner chairlift, expanded snowmaking system near beginner terrain and new parking lot.
- <u>Homewood Mountain Resort</u> upgrades its snowcat for the season which provides guided access to over 750 acres of backcountry terrain through Snowcat Adventures.
- Mt. Rose, North Lake Tahoe's highest base elevation at 8260-feet, invests \$2 million in mountain facilities, including 17 new snowmaking towers for increased snowmaking capacity.
- Northstar California installs 24 new Low-E snowmaking sticks, replacing old equipment to move toward the resort's commitment to a zero carbon footprint by 2030.
- <u>Squaw Valley | Alpine Meadows</u> completes a \$1.4 million renovation at Alpine Meadows Base Lodge. The resort will be powered by 100 percent renewable electricity as early as **Dec. 1**, reducing its total annual carbon footprint by 49 percent.
- <u>Sugar Bowl Resort</u> invests the first \$3 million of an \$8 million snowmaking system upgrade, doubling its water pumping capacity, reducing energy consumption and increasing snowmaking efficiency by two-thirds.
- <u>Tahoe Donner</u> introduces the new Snowbird triple chairlift, providing improved access to beginner terrain.

Lake Tahoe is a crown jewel of the Sierra. Formed approximately two million years ago, it is the largest alpine lake in North America and the second deepest in the United States. North Lake Tahoe spans two states and boasts two dozen beaches, twelve ski resorts, hundreds of miles of biking trails, half a dozen communities, and a growing number of nationally recognized human-powered events, races and festivals. North Lake Tahoe is a 45-minute drive from the Reno Tahoe International Airport, two hours from Sacramento International Airport and just over three hours from San Francisco International Airport.
