BOAT INSPECTION STATIONS

"Boat inspections are critical to maintaining the health of Lake Tahoe and our local recreation-based economy," said Dennis Zabaglo, Tahoe Regional Planning Agency's AquaticResources Program Manager. "Through the efforts of the Tahoe Resource Conservation District's trained inspectors and other private and public partners committed to the Lake, we expect to have another successful season."

All motorized watercraft require inspection for aquatic invasive species (AIS) prior to launching into Lake Tahoe, Fallen Leaf Lake and Echo Lake. Invasive species are highly advantageous and can be transported by non-motorized water recreation equipment as well. The Tahoe Keeper program was created to inform the paddling community about the importance of inspecting equipment, including: kayaks, paddleboards, fishing equipment, inflatable water toys and life jackets.

ALPINE MEADOWS INSPECTION STATION

California | Off of Hwy 89 (River Rd) on Alpine Meadows Rd in the Deer Park parking lot across from the Transfer Station.

Open 8:30am-5:30pm | 7 days a week

TRUCKEE-TAHOE INSPECTION STATION

California | Off Hwy 267 and Truckee Airport Road, on Chandelle Way

Open 8:30am-5:30pm | 7 days a week

MEYERS INSPECTION STATION

California | 2175 Keetak Street, on the South Shore near the intersection of Highways 89 and 50. Turn on Pomo St. off of HWY 89.

Open 8:30am-5:30pm | 7 days a week

SPOONER SUMMIT INSPECTION STATION

Nevada | Near the intersection of Hwy 28 and US 50, off of HWY 28 in the Snow Park area. Larger vessels should call 1.888.824.6267 for options.

Open 8:30am-5:30pm | 7 days a week

NOTE: Summer season is May 1-September 30

Boats with Ballast Tanks require decontamination. To save yourself time and money please make sure they are dry and drained. Alpine and Meyers inspection stations have better infrastructure to handle ballast boats (more hoses and water).

BOAT SAFETY

The elements that make up the attractive Lake Tahoe Basin environment also create significant hazards for boaters. A few of these are:

WIND

Sudden, high gusty winds of sufficient intensity to capsize a small craft are not unusual in the Basin. When a long dark line appears down the lake, gusty winds may be moving in your direction. The best thing to do is find a sheltering harbor.

UNDERWATER HAZARDS

Beware of underwater obstructions, such as rocks and old pilings, which may be exposed or barely covered near shorelines. Very hazardous areas of Lake Tahoe have been marked by the Coast Guard with red buoys, which should be kept between the vessel and the shore. These dangerous areas are shown on the National Ocean Survey Chart of Lake Tahoe, obtained at the Coast Guard Station in Lake Forest, and on boating maps sold at local sporting goods stores.

WATER TEMPERATURE

The water temperature of local lakes is very cold. Surface temperature is approximately 40 degrees during December through April. Summer temperatures may reach the upper 60's near shorelines. Sudden immersion in ice cold water can cause temporary paralysis with resulting helplessness and loss of buoyancy, causing the victim to sink without returning to the surface. The boater must be prepared at all times for adverse wind conditions. The wearing of personal flotation devices by all passengers aboard and the use of wet suits for water skiing is highly recommended.

REGULATIONS
