Being a responsible traveler is now more important than ever. The magic of North Lake Tahoe lies in the culture of the community and the natural beauty that surrounds it. To us, a responsible traveler is aware of the effects their travel has on the destination and the culture – both positive and negative.

So, before embarking on your journey to our beloved region, we ask you to join us in preparing and embracing the mindset of a responsible traveler. Not only do we need to think about our footprint when traveling, but we also need to put safety and compassion at the forefront. We have outlined some tips we hope you'll consider before your adventures begin. Small changes can make a world of difference.



BECOME A STEWARD OF LAKE TAHOE

- Leave spaces better than you found them.
- Adhere to instructions and signage.
- Lend a hand during one of our community clean-up days.
- Ride public transportation like our TART services.
- Support small businesses and events.



RESPECT THE ENVIRONMENT

- Preserve North Lake Tahoe's beauty.
- Leave no trace by packing out what you brought in.
- Dispose of trash in designated receptacles.
- Stay on trails to not disturb landscape.
- Be mindful of your and pets' actions.
- Say no to plastic and bring your own reusable water bottle and shopping bags.
- Adhere to boat inspection regulations.



STAY EDUCATED

- Check weather conditions beforehand and make sure to have the appropriate safety equipment.
- Prepare in advance when visiting the outdoors like downloading maps and checking regional area conditions/closures
- Call businesses before your trip to learn about hours of operation, protocols and any other pertinent information.
- Sign up for county and state text alerts to stay connected to travel advisories and emergency updates.



KEEP WILDLIFE WILD

- Observe wildlife from a respectful distance to ensure your and their safety.
- Never feed animals or leave food/garbage behind.
- Follow instructions on how to dispose of trash correctly, especially with bear boxes.



BE FIRE SAFE

- Consult fire restrictions before lighting a campfire or starting a grill.
- Know the permitting rules ahead of burning anything outdoors.
- Never use fireworks.
- Be sure to soak, stir and feel fire ashes before disposing.
- Maintain your vigilance and be prepared in the event of an emergency.



DEMONSTRATE MINDFUL

- Practice kindness, patience and commit to following health and safety protocols.
- Be a good neighbor by keeping noise down and parking in designated areas.
- Travel with awareness and observe the impact of your actions.

HELPFUL HINTS

Before you make your trip to North Lake Tahoe, whether for the day or for a few nights, make sure you have necessities with you and have made arrangements to ensure a safe trip.

WHAT TO BRING

- Gear
 - » If bringing your own aquatics gear (i.e. kayaks, boats, etc.) make sure they are in line with lake guidances and regulations.
- » Patience
- » Businesses are navigating procedures and protocols to ensure your safety and the safety of their employees.

- Reusable Items
 - » Bring reusable water bottles, utensils and shopping bags as grocery stores charge for bags. Plus it helps eliminate waste.
 - » Connect with your lodging property to ask any questions you may have before your stay.
 - » Pre-book guided tours and pack your own equipment.
 - » Make dining reservations and confirm services and hours align with your trip expectations.
- Stay up-to-date on social media channels and business' websites for real-time information
- Set up tap-to-pay with your phone/smartwatch or contact-less credit card
- Help protect Lake Tahoe's beauty and health by sharing your observations in the Citizens Science App

GETTING HERE

Reno-Tahoe International Airport

- » Conveniently located just 45 minutes away, the Reno-Tahoe International Airport offers various non-stop flights serviced by multiple airlines, with convenient connections from virtually any city in the US and abroad.
- » Travelers are recommended to check-in online and arrive 90–120 minutes prior to departure.



Plus, everything comes with a side of breathtaking scenery.

- Check out the Tahoe Food Hub which provides locally-owned restaurants with fresh, in-season ingredients for local chefs to make magic with.
- Call ahead and make reservations if available.
- Enjoy outdoor scenery by taking your meals to go.
- Make sure to pack up any trash to keep the splendors of Lake Tahoe pristine.

SHOPPING

Shopping in North Lake Tahoe takes you on an odyssey into five charming areas filled with artisan treasures hard to find anywhere else. Each of the resorts and towns offer a distinct selection of local boutiques, shops and markets that make it delightfully fun to support local businesses.



OLYMPIC VALLEY

Whether you're in the market for ski or summer gear, tasty confections or custom-made gifts, Olympic Valley is home to some of the most luxurious and quality shopping in the region.

2 TAHOE CITY

Experience a one-of-a-kind lakeside shopping trip in Tahoe City. Discover art galleries, museums, gift shops, boutiques, toy shops and other local eccentricities, sure to satisfy shoppers who want to take home a unique piece of North Lake Tahoe.

3 NORTHSTAR CALIFORNIA

Northstar's family-friendly shopping Village offers the perfect day trip getaway no matter the season. Enjoy a skating rink, fire pits, diverse dining establishments and high-end retail options with knowledgeable staff.

Soak in views of North Lake Tahoe as you stroll this region filled with stores offering locallymade goods such as furniture, pottery, stand-up paddleboards and home décor.

The boutiques in Incline Village offer local charm in addition to hand-crafted jewelry, bohemian-style clothing and other eclectic treasures.

OUTDOOR

With its sparkling blue waters, phenomenal mountain scenery and endless recreation, North Lake Tahoe is a destination committed to protecting the environment and leading the way in sustainability.

Lake Tahoe

- » One of the clearest bodies of water in the world, due to its significant depth, low watershed rate and granite composition.
- » UC Davis TERC launched the Citizen Science Tahoe app, which encourages visitors to tap in what they see at Lake Tahoe. Data is shared with scientists to better understand conditions from various locations around the lake and from multiple dates throughout the year.
- » Many communities take their tap water directly from Lake Tahoe, which has been named the best drinking water in the country. The water is drawn deep below the surface and far from the shore.

Forest and Wildlife

- » The Lake Tahoe Basin is home to over 290 animals and more than 1,000 plant species.
- » It is also home to many different types of birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians and insects including Tahoe residents such as the Sierra Red Fox, Lahontan Cutthroat Trout and the Mountain Beaver.
- » To keep wildlife wild, never feed the animals. Once a wild animal becomes food-conditioned it loses its natural fear of people and public places.
- » Observe wildlife from a respectful distance to ensure their safety and yours.

SUSTAINABLE ACTIVITIES

If you're looking for some fun Lake Tahoe activities, North Lake Tahoe offers mile after mile of stunning panoramas and every type imaginable. Unwind on the lake with a picturesque kayak or stand up paddle in the summer. Snowshoe or ride a snow bike on the trails in the winter, take a zip-line in the fall or stroll the towns in the spring. There is something for every season and every person. Remember to explore and experience the region safely and responsibly.

- Check for restrictions or closures due to inclement weather conditions
- Play during off-peak hours
 - » Try a sunrise hike, a morning round of snowshoeing or stargazing at night.
- Reusable materials
 - » Bring reusable materials like utensils and water bottles. Stay well hydrated when outdoors.
- Pack out trash

Call ahead

- » Confirm rental equipment will be available and find out which items (helmets, gloves, etc.) you may need to bring with you.
- Park safely
 - » If parking on the side of the road, make sure you're in an appropriate and legal area. There is no parking on the side of the road November – April.



- Lots of cars at a trailhead means the trail is busy. Find another place to explore.
- **Don't congregate** at trailheads.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITY PROVIDERS

- **Carefully review** pre-arrival information for activities.
- Drink Tahoe Tap
 - » Bring refillable water bottles to stay hydrated during your activities.
- Digital forms
 - » When possible, fill out release forms digitally before arrival.

GOLF COURSES

- Tee times may be required in advance.
- Select a tee time during less busier periods for a discounted price.

BOATING

- Lake Tahoe "Tahoe Only" boating
 - » Boating on Lake Tahoe is open to all boats with an aquatic invasive species inspection seal.
 - » Seals can be acquired at any of the regional watercraft inspection stations. All motorized watercraft are required to get an inspection.
 - » Make sure you clean, drain and dry your boat and all compartments to save time at inspection stations.
 - » Paddlers and non-motorized watercraft can self-inspect and proceed to launch as long as they are free of aquatic invasive species.

Donner Lake boating

» Submit a self-inspection form to the City of Truckee to receive your Aquatic Invasive Species sticker.

NON-MOTORIZED WATER SPORTS

Non-motorized watercrafts, like kayaks and paddleboards, are currently allowed on Lake Tahoe.

- Clean, drain and dry
 - » Self-inspect your personal watercraft, every time prior to launching, to limit the spread of aquatic invasive species.
- Always wear a life jacket
- Rafting the Truckee River from Tahoe City
 - » Book your rafts early.
 - » Note that alcohol is prohibited during the 4th of July holiday.

- Check for restrictions or closures

Limited parking

» Some state parks will have limited parking. Walk or bike if you can.

Furry-friend rules

- » Check if dogs are allowed and, if so, follow the rules and use a leash.
- » If it's your dog, then it's your doody please clean up, dog waste is an environmental pollutant.

BACKCOUNTRY SKIING, SNOWBOARDING & SNOWMOBILING

- It's imperative to be well versed in avalanche safety and search and rescue techniques before venturing out of ski area boundaries.
 - » It can take hours or days for rescue personnel to assist when there's trouble in the backcountry. You need to be responsible for your own actions.

BACK COUNTRY TRAINING >

COURSE PROVIDERS >

- All members of your group must have basic avalanche rescue gear transceiver, shovel and probe. Regularly practice using all safety equipment before taking it into the backcountry.
 - » If snowmobiling, make sure safety gear is attached to your body, not your sled.
- Check with the Sierra Avalanche Center for up-to-date conditions and snowpack stability.
- Never travel in the backcountry on the day after a big storm. Allow snowpack to settle for at least 24 hours.

- Many lodging properties and ski resorts have instilled skiing and snowboarding green practices including lighting, energy and water preservation.
- Adhere to resort requests to ensure a safe skiing and riding experience.

- The villages in North Lake Tahoe have their own unique character and charm.
- Après ski is the long revered tradition of ending your day on the slopes with friends and family, perhaps an adult beverage or two, all while trading tales of your snow-filled adventures.
 - » Consider exploring the towns of North Lake Tahoe throughout the region to spread out while supporting local businesses.
 - » Use this handy guide to experience North Lake Tahoe like a local and sip to the good life. But make sure to consider modifications to continue with safe practices.

SNOW BIKING

Bring repair gear so you can be self-sufficient in case of a flat.

SLEDDING

- Many ski areas feature groomed snow-play areas and tubing lanes.
- Respect signage and only sled in approved areas.
- No sled left behind. Take all garbage with you after a fun day on the hills.

ICE SKATING


- Call or visit location websites for more information.


