8. Donner Memorial State Park

Scenic park located on the east shore of Donner Lake. Plenty of flat, open areas to play in the snow. Park offers winter cross country ski and snowshoe trails. Visitor Center open daily, 10am - 5pm. Parking fees. Restrooms available.

9. Donner Lake West End Beach

Flat, open beach area located on the west end of Donner Lake with scenic views. Provides ample space for building a snowman or playing in the snow. Free parking in a large, plowed lot (approx. 60 spaces). West End Beach winter snow play area made possible with Sustainable Truckee sponsorship. Operated by Truckee-Donner Recreation & Park District.

10. Truckee River Regional Park

Family-friendly park close to Downtown Truckee. Features an ice skating rink, sledding hill (conditions dependent), scenic paved paths, and flat open areas to build a snowman or toss around snowballs. Free parking in a large, plowed lot. Restrooms available. Operated by Truckee-Donner Recreation & Park District.

11. Donner Summit SNO-PARK

No sledding hills but many spots to build a snowman or make snow angels. Fresh donuts and hot chocolate sold on-site during weekends. High-use area: arrive early and have a plan B. Parking pass required Nov 1st - May 30th. Purchase pass online. Restrooms available.

12. Johnson Canyon

Forested area located off of Interstate 80 with gentle hills for sledding, flat areas for snow play, and tall pines to take cover behind during an epic snowball fight. The 280-acre canyon is protected by the Truckee Donner Land Trust.

13. Trout Creek Trail - North

Three-mile round trip, out and back, scenic paved path that is plowed in winter and connects the Tahoe Donner neighborhood to Downtown Truckee. Open area at the trailhead for kids to have fun in the snow. Easy, free parking.

14. Old Greenwood Snow Play


When conditions allow, Truckee Donner Land Trust plows their Old Greenwood conservation easement on the northwest corner of the Overland Trail exit off of Interstate 80, providing access to a low-elevation snow play area near Downtown Truckee.

15. McIver Dairy Meadow

Environmentally sensitive area that was restored in 2019. Take extra care of the sensitive snow play area and consider visiting one of the other locations on this list. Pick up and pack out all trash, and respect signage. NO parking next to the sledding area. Paid parking available past the first roundabout in Downtown Truckee.
